The material price adjustment is made and computed in accordance with Section S-109 of the Standard Specifications for State Aid Road and Bridge Construction 2004 Edition. The material price adjustment for Hot Mix Asphalt will be adjusted using three published prices issued by the MDOT State Construction Engineer on a monthly basis, approximately between the 5th and 10th of each month and shall apply to all materials placed for that calendar month. These prices are: Gasoline, Diesel and Asphalt Cement (PG-67-22) (AC). The total price adjustment is based on the sum of the fuel price adjustment and the material price adjustment. The fuel price adjustment may be positive or negative if the deviation is 5%, more or less, than the monthly published rate for April 2025 (month previous to bid letting) as issued on April 3, 2025, and computed in accordance with S-109.08. The material price adjustment will be based on the percent of AC used during production times the price differential (bid vs. placement) with no minimum amount of change required and may be positive or negative. Month Previous to Bid Base Gasoline cost is \$2.458/gallon; Base Diesel Cost is \$2.702/gallon; and Base Asphalt Cement (PG-67-22) is \$2.466/gallon.

Due to the volatility experienced with and anticipated with petroleum-based products over the coming yearly term it is desirable to move toward an equitable based pricing arrangement for both the county and the vendor that compensates for the anticipated fluctuations in market conditions. As such, bids are requested for **plus** or **minus** the liquid asphalt emulsion (CRS-2) price established via the monthly "industry wide current petroleum products base prices for contracts" as published by the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) State Construction Engineer on MDOT's Letting Calendar (https://mdot.ms.gov/portal/letting_calendar). The plus or minus amount shall be expressed in dollars and cents or decimal fraction thereof. The MDOT monthly price with the vendor's price adjustment (plus or minus amount) as per the bid shall be in effect from the date of publishing until the publication for the following month.
