Further, persons and/or entities placing utility infrastructure on right-of-way of Neshoba County, upon grant of the Board of Supervisors, shall return said right-of-way to its previous safe condition once placement or construction is complete. Failure to return the right-of-way to its previous safe condition will require immediate removal of utility placement and/or construction at the cost of the person and/or entity causing the damage or the owner of the utility infrastructure.
